One of the most world-known playwrights, William Shakespeare, had written numerous plays, poems, and literary works. He is famous for both his humor and creativity and use of words; these talents and his hard work allowed him to create so many distinguished literary pieces, especially his plays, throughout centuries. Interestingly, the Reduced Shakespeare Company wrote a parody using Shakespeare's works and ideas - they produced The Complete Works of William Shakespeare Abridged. One of the most special things about this play is that each person plays, at least, more than 2 roles. And also, they expanded the play that was originally played by three actors into a huge cast of thirteen. Having been rehearsing every day after school, from three to five-thirty, the cast of The Complete Work of
